



Innogy Renewables UK Kiln Pit Hill Windfarm Community Fund

The RWE npower innogy Kiln Pit Hill Windfarm Community Fund at the Community Foundation has an allocation of £15,000 for grants to voluntary and community projects based in the parish of Shotley Low Quarter. Applicants can apply for a minimum of £250 up to £15,000.

What can be funded – examples of what grants will support: -

Capital items (for example, games, resources, equipment etc.)
Revenue items (for example, trips and entrance fees)
Sessional worker costs (for example, workshop tutors)
Repairs and/or refurbishment to a community building
Start-up costs for new community groups
Out of school activities
Voluntary and community group activities
Community and environmental projects

This list is not exhaustive and all applications will be given due consideration by the advisory panel.

What will not be funded:

Retrospective grants;
Replacing statutory responsibility (for example school curriculum activities, road repairs etc.);
Political campaigns;
Religious campaigns;
Things that could bring the reputation of the Community Foundation into disrepute;
Projects that generate income for personal gain;
Repayment of loans or debts.

Who can apply:

Constituted voluntary and community groups based within the boundary of the Shotley Low Quarter Parish. (This includes the Parish Council).

Grants for individuals may be considered under special circumstances

Applicants should demonstrate that their project has community benefit and charitable aims.

The Community Foundation requires the following documents/information with the application, we cannot consider proposals without ALL documentation:

Constitution;

Groups recent accounts (or book keeping record if first year of operation);

Minimum of two unrelated signatories;

Group bank statement (or letter from bank confirming details);

Child Protection Policy/Vulnerable adult statement;

Quotes for items required (or please demonstrate where costs have come from).
